


Welcome to the WSSCB Email Bulletin February 2019

The WSSCB carry out a number of **Serious Case Reviews** (SCRs) which each come with their own learning. Each SCR will have several learning points, designed to inform the practice of workers and to prevent a similar incident from happening again in the future. These learning points support practitioners in their knowledge, understanding and practice of safeguarding and provide opportunities for Managers and Team leaders to reflect on current practice and explore potential ways of improving the way systems work, how processes are carried out and also whether change needs to happen.
