

Those professionals who attended an Early Help Safeguarding Awareness Day during Safeguarding Month will have heard of ICON. This is an evidence based programme consisting of a series of brief 'touchpoint' interventions that reinforce a simple message to prevent abusive head trauma (previously known as shaken baby). The acronym ICON's message is;

Infant crying is normal and it will stop
Comfort methods can sometimes soothe
It's OK to walk away
Never shake a baby



The WSSCP will be launching this preventative initiative to enable professionals to support parent and carers. **Launch sessions** will be available to provide professionals from a range of agencies with the knowledge to carry out work linked directly to ICON.
