| | Job Role |

| Group 1 | Staff in infrequent contact with children, young people and/or parents/carers who may become aware of possible abuse or neglect. For example, librarians, GP receptionists, community advice centre staff, groundsmen, recreation assistants, environmental health officers, housing officers |
| Group 2 | Staff with intensive contact either regular or irregular. For example volunteers, development officers, housing, general hospital staff, faith groups, sports development officers, play scheme volunteers, police (other than those in specialist child protection roles). |
| Group 3 | Staff whose main role involves children and young people, for example those involved in planning and assessing children and family needs, youth workers, GP's, midwives, probation officers, workers in sexual health, those working with adults around disabilities, mental health, substance misuse and community play schemes. |
| Group 4 | Those in the workforce who have responsibilities relating to Section 47 (child abuse) enquiries, such as specialist child protection workers including Health Visitors, Police, Child Protection Social workers, Conference Chairs and |
| Group 5 | Designated child protection Leads |
| Group 6 | Those who manage groups in 3 and 4 and including front line managers and managers of child protection units |
| Group 7 | Senior managers involved in work at a strategic level. |
| Group 8 | Members of the WSSCP including, Partnership members, Independent chair, Directors of Children's Services, Elected and lay member, members of executive and sub/task groups, business support team Inter-agency trainers |
