



See Something Say Something

West Sussex Safeguarding Children Partnership has launched the **See Something Say Something** safeguarding campaign in association with Brighton and Hove Safeguarding Children Partnership. The aim of the campaign is to raise awareness within all communities and the general public that everyone has a role in keeping children in West Sussex safe.

The message is simple – if you **see something** that raises a concern about a child, please **say something** by reporting it to the Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) on 01403 229900. Trained professionals from police, children’s services and health are on hand to offer advice and act where needed. If you think a child is at immediate risk, call police on 999.

We recognise this is a very difficult time for families, many of whom are having to deal with additional financial pressures and worries as a result of the impact of the Covid-19 restrictions. In addition, many children are not currently in school and are spending long periods indoors. We want to ensure that everyone who needs extra support and advice is aware of and has access to the help that is available to them. There is information and resources that you can access on the [WSSCP website](#) which has contact details for various agencies and charities who can help.

Safeguarding is everyone’s responsibility. In these exceptional times we need our communities to come together to support and safeguard children across the county. We need you to help keep children visible during this uncertain time.
