
We are busy working with the West Sussex Safeguarding Adult Board and the WSCC Community Safety teams to plan for **Safeguarding month** this November! This will be a month of learning and development opportunities for professionals working with children, young people and vulnerable adults across West Sussex. The request for support for professionals form used to refer children into the **MASH** has been **adapted** and now provides a space for workers to say whether they have completed a Neglect Identification Measurement Tool (NIMT) if there are concerns around neglect. This is designed to be a prompt and not a barrier. If professionals are worried about neglect and have not completed a NIMT their referral **will** still be accepted as before. It is hoped that including this prompt will raise awareness of the NIMT and encourage more professionals to include NIMTs as part of the referral process when raising concerns around neglect.
